Operational Requirements Document (ORD)

The Joint Requirements Oversight Council (JROC) approved the GCSS-MC ORD and validated the enclosed Key Performance Parameters (KPPs). The JROC considers the KPPs essential to meet the stated ORD mission need. ORD approval authority for non-KPP changes is delegated to the Marine Corps. Additionally, the program is assigned the Joint Potential Designator of “JROC Interest.”
