

Special Training Allowance Pool (STAP) Consolidation Initiative

Introduction

This link is intended for informational purposes only and is maintained as a venue for information of interest on the consolidation of STAP assets under a single contractor logistics support (CLS) manager.

Background Information

The Consolidated Issue Facility (CIF) under contractor logistics support was established in 2000 when the CMC directed centralized logistics management of infantry combat equipment (ICE), Class II, Type I items. In 2003, DC, I&L described the concept of consolidating other Class II commodities, thus further reducing the Operating Forces logistics footprint and realigning Marines back to the Operating Force structure.

As the Total Life Cycle Manager (TLCM), Program Manager Infantry Combat Equipment (PM-ICE) is the single point of accountability and responsibility for timely and effective acquisition, fielding, and sustainment of infantry combat equipment to include life cycle management of cold weather clothing and equipment assets, Class II Type-3 held in the Special Training Allowance Pool (STAP) or CTEP/TAP.

In coordination with the MARCORSSYSCOM Strategic Logistics Asset Management (SLAM) Team and Logistics Command, (LOGCOM) Albany, GA, PM-ICE is affecting two parallel operational efforts. The first is in the coordinated effort for the enterprise wide consolidation of CIF/CBRN/STAP/Shelters, Tents, and Netting under a single contractor logistics support (CLS) manager. The second is an independent assessment of STAP operations under CLS with I MEF STAP as the test bed. At contract award for the first effort, the independent assessment (second effort) will merge into one, effectively concluding the assessment function.

Independent Assessment Objective

- Assess PM-ICE TLCM functional metrics and measure performance in preparation for effective total acquisition, fielding, sustainment and funding of infantry combat equipment by FY 08.
- Employ a temporary CLS force for warehouse operations at I MEF STAP and return Marine structure to 1st MLG.
- Develop STAP inventory model for the future consolidation under a single CLS manager.
- Share assessment results with MARFORS and other interested parties.

Assessment Period

It is anticipated that the contract to a single CLS manger will be awarded early, FY 08, at which time the migration of PM-ICE I MEF STAP operations shall transfer to the awarded single CLS manager.
